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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 110, L.D. 336

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3300-A is enacted to read:

4 §3300-A. Confidentiality of personal information of applicant or licensee

An applicant or licensee shall provide the board with a 8 current professional address and telephone number, which will be their public contact address, and a personal residence address 10 and telephone number. An applicant's or licensee's personal residence address and telephone number is confidential information and may not be disclosed except as permitted by this 12 section or as required by law, unless the personal residence address and telephone number have been provided as the public 14 contact address. Personal health information submitted as part of any application is confidential information and may not be 16 disclosed except as permitted by this section or as required by 18 law. The personal health information and personal residence address and telephone number may be provided to other 20 governmental licensing or disciplinary authorities or to any health care providers located within or outside this State that are concerned with granting, limiting or denying a physician's 22 employment or privileges.' 24

SUMMARY

28 This amendment clarifies the information that the Board of Licensure in Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Licensure are 30 required to keep confidential and allows the boards to share an applicant's or licensee's personal address and telephone number with governmental licensing or disciplinary authorities or any 32 health care providers that are concerned with regulating a physician's employment or privileges. The amendment further 34 provides that personal health information submitted as part of an 36 application is confidential but can also be shared with other appropriate regulatory entities.
