Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 **Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §3814**, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 314, §65
4 and amended by PL 1999, c. 401, Pt. J, §4, is further amended to

§3814. Transportation

8 All court-ordered ~~and--court-related~~ transportation of
10 juvenile detainees ~~to--and--from--the--Southern--Maine--Juvenile~~
12 ~~Facility~~ between a correctional facility authorized by the
14 department to house juvenile detainees and a courthouse is the
responsibility of the sheriff of the county in which the court is
located.

18 **SUMMARY**

20 This bill would relieve the county of the cost of
22 transporting juveniles other than to a courthouse. The cost of
other court-ordered transportation would be the responsibility of
the State.
