34	1. Appointment. The Director of the Bureau of Forestry

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4. Training. Except as provided in subsection 6, a forest
ranger and the state supervisor authorized under subsection 3 to perform the duties of law enforcement officers must successfully
meet and maintain the training standards and certification requirements for full-time law enforcement officers as
established in Title 25, chapter 341.

 8 5. Equipment. The state supervisor and any forest ranger who has successfully completed the training and certification
10 required under subsection 4 must be issued personal protective equipment, including, but not limited to, body armor, handcuffs,
12 pepper spray, firearms, magazines, magazine holders, duty belts, ammunition and other related materiel for the protection of the
14 public, the forest ranger and the state supervisor.

16 6. Exemption. A person employed by the State prior to October 1, 2001 as a forest ranger or as the state supervisor may 18 continue to be employed in that capacity without successful completion of the training and certification required in 20 subsection 4. A person who has not successfully completed the training and certification required in subsection 4 may not be 22 issued a firearm by the bureau and is not authorized to carry a firearm while in the performance of the duties of a forest ranger 24 or state supervisor.

Sec. 4. 25 MRSA §2801-B, sub-§1, \PC , as amended by PL 1999, c. 682, §3, is further amended to read:

C. Agents or representatives of the Department of Conservation, Bureau of Forestry, whose law enforcement powers are limited to those specified by Title 12, section 8901, subsection 3 and who are specifically exempted under Title 12, section 8901, subsection 6;

Sec. 5. PL 1999, c. 352, §§3 and 4 are repealed.

Sec. 6. Plan for training at Maine Criminal Justice Academy. No later than October 1, 2001, the Commissioner of Conservation shall send a letter to each person employed as a state forest ranger to ascertain that person's willingness to be certified as a law enforcement officer and to determine that person's level of training and experience in law enforcement. The commissioner shall request that responses be returned to the commissioner no later than November 1, 2001.

The Commissioner of Conservation, in consultation with the Commissioner of Public Safety, shall develop a plan to address
training needs of people currently employed as forest rangers and a timeline for the training and certification of forest rangers
and the State Supervisor, Division of Forest Protection within

46	SUMMARY				
48	This amendment is one of 2 minority reports. This amendment allows a forest ranger or a State Supervisor, Division of Forest				

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Protection within the Department of Conservation employed prior 2 to October 1, 2001 to continue serving in that capacity without successfully completing the training required of persons appointed to those positions after October 1, 2001. It clarifies 4 that appointments to those positions made after October 1, 2001 6 are contingent on successful completion of law enforcement training and certification. It directs the Commissioner of 8 Conservation to work with the Commissioner of Public Safety to establish a schedule for the state supervisor and forest rangers that will provide for completion of training and certification no 10 later than July 1, 2004 at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

The amendment also corrects an obsolete reference to the 14 State Supervisor, Forest Fire Operations to the correct term of State Supervisor, Division of Forest Protection.

This amendment also repeals Public Law 1999, chapter 352, 18 section 4, which prohibited the Department of Conservation to purchase certain equipment without legislative approval.

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This amendment also adds an appropriation and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
