This amendment is one of 2 minority reports of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. It replaces the bill. It repeals the statutory provision that allows the Director of the Bureau of Forestry within the Department of Conservation to expand a forest ranger's authority to arrest a person committing a crime involving physical force against a person. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
