Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §7229, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 398, §8, is 4 repealed and the following enacted in its place:

6 §7229. Maintenance charges for private crossings

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8 1. Municipal officers. In a municipality in which a private way is crossed by a railroad, the municipal officers may
10 act as agents for a railroad corporation in collecting maintenance and insurance charges from those property owners
12 using that crossing. This section does not authorize a municipality to assess or levy these charges or to use its taxing
14 power to collect these charges.

 16 2. Exception for current property owners. Railroad corporations may not collect maintenance and insurance charges
18 from property owners who, on or before the effective date of this subsection, use rights-of-way on private crossings that existed
20 prior to the effective date of this subsection.

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits railroad corporations from collecting 26 maintenance and insurance fees from property owners using rights-of-way on private crossings prior to the effective date of 28 this bill.
