22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

26	'Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
28	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6134, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 48, 1 , is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
30	<u>§6134. Alewives passage; fishways on St. Croix River</u>
32	1. Fishways must allow passage of alewives. By May 1,
34	2002, the commissioner and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall ensure that fishways on the Woodland Dam and the Grand Falls Dam, both located on the St. Croix River, are
36	configured or operated in a manner that allows the passage of no
2.0	more than 90,000 alewives per year.
38	2. Reporting requirement. The department in conjunction
40	with the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall report
	to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
42	jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
44	over marine resources matters on December 31, 2003 and every 2 vears thereafter regarding the impact the run of alewives

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<u>permitted under this section has on upstream ecosystems and fisheries.</u>

4	3. Closure of the fishways on the St. Croix River. The
	commissioner and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and
б	Wildlife, or their successor agencies, have rule-making authority
	to temporarily or permanently close fishways on the St. Croix
8	River if the commissioners concur in their assessment that the
	fisheries in the St. Croix River are suffering an adverse impact
10	from the presence of anadromous fish utilizing the fishways on
	the St. Croix River. The commissioners shall issue a report to
12	the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
	jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the
14	joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
	over marine resources matters within 90 days of closure of the
16	fishways. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine
	technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter

20 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

26 The Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional 28 costs to submit required reports to the Legislature, to adopt certain rules and to close certain fishways under certain 30 circumstances. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

36 This amendment removes the emergency provisions and requires the Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to allow the passage of no more than 38 90,000 alewives annually at the Woodland Dam and Grand Falls Dam 40 located on the St. Croix River by May 1, 2002. The amendment also requires both departments to report back to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 42 inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine 44 resources matters on December 31, 2003 and every 2 years thereafter regarding the impact the additional alewives have on 46 the upstream ecosystem and fisheries. The amendment grants the 48 Commissioner of Marine Resources and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife the authority to close the fishway by 50 routine technical rulemaking if the commissioners determine that

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the fisheries in the St. Croix River are being adversely impacted
by anadromous fish utilizing the fishways on the river. The amendment requires the commissioners to report back to the joint
standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters and the joint standing
committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters within 90 days of the closure of a fishway on
the St. Croix River. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
