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Whereas, a significant amount of conflicting information exists regarding the environmental and economic impacts that may result from opening the Woodland Dam and the Grand Falls Dam fishways to the passage of alewives; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Hiring an independent consultant. Resolved: That the Legislative Council, after consultation with the chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Standing Committee on Marine Resources recommendation of the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis, shall hire an independent consultant to review and evaluate the issues associated with the proposal to allow the passage of alewives at the Woodland Dam and the Grand Falls Dam fishways on the St. Croix River. The contractor must be unbiased, nonpartisan and work under the auspices of the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis. The consultant must have expertise in inland fisheries management and conservation, anadromous fish, economic principles and analysis and governmental relations and have no real or perceived interests in the St. Croix River or any inland body of water associated with the St. Croix River that would prevent the consultant from providing a complete and impartial analysis of the issues proposed for study by this resolve; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Duties. Resolved: That the consultant shall review and analyze existing scientific data and other reliable information to determine:
  - The natural history and historic range of alewives within the St. Croix River;
- 2. The natural history and ecology of the St. Croix River, 38 its tributaries and inland waters surficially connected to the river or its tributaries;
  - 3. The evolution of the sport fisheries associated with the St. Croix River and their economic importance both locally and regionally;
- 4. Any impact the landlocked alewives and the release of alewives may have on the ecosystem of the St. Croix River, its tributaries and inland waters surficially connected to the river or its tributaries:

## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " to H.P. 287, L.D. 365

\$ B

The Atlantic Salmon Commission, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources will incur some minor additional costs to consult with a particular contractor. These costs can be absorbed within the agencies' existing budgeted resources.'

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## **SUMMARY**

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This resolve is a minority report and requires the Legislative Council, in consultation with the chairs of both the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Standing Committee on Marine Resources recommendation of the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis, to hire an independent consultant to study the biological and economic issues surrounding the proposed passage of alewives at the Woodland Dam and Grand Falls Dam fishways. The resolve directs the consultant to work under the auspices of the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis in consultation with numerous interested governmental and private organizations and to report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources no later than January 1, 2002. The resolve also appropriates \$50,000 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill
