The bill would increase the workers' compensation weekly benefit paid to certain workers. The State's costs are estimated to increase approximately \$50,000 per year. This increase would be reflected in the workers' compensation rates paid by each state agency. The specific increases to specific agencies and therefore the impact to specific fund sources (i.e. General Fund) can not be determined at this time.'

This amendment replaces the bill. Instead of allowing an injured employee to sue the employer outside the workers' compensation system, the amendment provides for an increase in the percentage of wages payable as a benefit to an employee whose serious injury, disease or death was caused by a health hazard that constitutes a violation of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, provided the employer had notice of the hazard prior to the injury, disease or death. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
