22	Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble.
24	Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "§1580-E." by striking out all of subsection 2 and inserting in
26	its place the following:
28	'2. Vehicle prohibition. A foster parent is prohibited from smoking in that foster parent's private vehicle that is used
30	for transporting the foster child and may not allow any other
32	person to smoke in that vehicle when a foster child is in that foster parent's care, even if the child is not in the vehicle.'
34	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

38	'Sec. 2. Licensing rules. The Department of Human Services shall amend the foster home licensing rules to prohibit smoking
40	in family foster homes effective July 1, 2002. The department
40	shall adopt procedures for responding to and revoking the license of foster homes where smoking is taking place. Rules adopted
42	pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter
44	II-A.

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Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2002.

2	Further amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency clause.
4	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the
6	summary the following:
8	FISCAL NOTE
10	The Bureau of Child and Family Services within the Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional
12	costs to amend the rules of foster home licensing to prohibit smoking in family foster homes and to adopt procedures for
14	responding to and revoking the license of foster homes where smoking is taking place. These costs can be absorbed within the
16	bureau's existing budgeted resources.'

20	SUMMARI
	This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It
22	adds an effective date of July 1, 2002 and clarifies that the car of the foster parent in which smoking is prohibited is the car in
24	which the foster child is transported. The amendment also removes the emergency preamble and emergency clause. The
26	amondment also adds a figsal note
