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## 'FISCAL NOTE

The Bureau of Child and Family Services within the Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to amend the rules of foster home licensing to prohibit smoking in family foster homes and to adopt procedures for responding to and revoking the license of foster homes where smoking is taking place. These costs can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.'

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## **SUMMARY**

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This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It adds an effective date of July 1, 2002 and clarifies that the car of the foster parent in which smoking is prohibited is the car in which the foster child is transported. The amendment also removes the emergency preamble and emergency clause. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

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
