	1. Implementation of E-9-1-1 by local exchange telephone
	utility. Each local exchange telephone utility offering service
	over the public switched network, in accordance with rules and
	procedures adopted by the bureau, shall implement the E-9-1-1
	system and provide the universal emergency telephone number 9-1-1
	for use by the public in seeking emergency services assistance
	through the E-9-1-1 system.
	2. Required information for E-9-1-1 database. Each local
	exchange telephone utility shall provide to the bureau or its
	designee the automatic number identification, automatic location
	identification and any other information required to establish
	and maintain the E-9-1-1 database and service in accordance with
	the rules adopted by the bureau.
	3. Coordination of E-9-1-1 service; coordinator. Each
	local exchange telephone utility and cellular or wireless
	telecommunications service provider within the State shall
	coordinate all implementation, operation and maintenance directly
	relating to E-9-1-1 through the bureau and shall designate a
	person to coordinate with and provide all relevant information to
	the bureau to carry out the purposes of the chapter.
	Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical
	rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.
	SUMMARY
	This bill adds definitions and requires every telephone
	utility providing local exchange service in Maine to implement
	Enhanced 9-1-1 and to provide the necessary subscriber
	information to the E-9-1-1 system in the format and frequency

established by Department of Public Safety, Emergency Services
Communication Bureau rules. It also requires each telephone utility and cellular or wireless telecommunications service
provider to designate a contact person for all matters relating to E-9-1-1 service.
