An Act to Account for Homeschooled Children Under the School Funding Formula and to Require the Maine Educational Assessment for Homeschooled Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §5021, sub-§8, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 439, §1, is amended to read: 4

8. Reinbursement for students enrolled in equivalent 6 instruction programs. A school administrative unit is entitled to receive state subsidy for any student who receives instruction 8 through one or more on-site academic courses from a public school 10 but is not a full-time student. A school administrative unit that sends any tuition student to another school administrative 12 unit or to a private school approved pursuant to chapter 219 is also entitled to receive state subsidy under this subsection. The rate of reimbursement must be established in increments of 14 0.25 full-time equivalent status up to 1.0 full-time equivalent status based on the average amount of time per day that a student 16 receives on-site academic services from a public school. School administrative units shall keep an accurate count of the number 18 of students receiving on-site academic services and shall include the full-time equivalency status of these students in the annual 20 count of students attending school in accordance with section 22 6004. A student enrolled in an equivalent instruction program at home who does not receive instruction through on-site academic 24 courses is included in the funding formula for the school administrative unit in which that student resides as equal to .25 26 of a full-time regular student for funding purposes. 28

Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §5021, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

30 Examination of students enrolled in equivalent 9. instruction programs. A student enrolled in an equivalent instruction program, including home instruction, is required to 32 participate in the Maine Educational Assessment exams.

Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §15605, sub-§2, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. G, §§2 and 4, is amended to read: 36

38 Α. The foundation per pupil operating rate shall-be is the summary of actual local operating costs of all school administrative units of the base year adjusted to the year 40 prior to the year of allocation divided by the average total resident pupils in sections 5104 and 6004 educated at public 42 expense in kindergarten to grade 12 on April 1st and October 1st of the calendar year prior to the year of allocation. 44

(1) The elementary foundation per pupil operating rate 46 shall-be is the summary of actual local operating costs of all school administrative units of the base year 48 adjusted to the year prior to the year of allocation

divided by the average total resident pupils in sections 5104 and 6004 educated at public expense in 2 kindergarten to grade 8 on April 1st and October 1st of the calendar year prior to the year of allocation. 4 The secondary foundation per pupil operating rate 6 (2) shall-be is the summary of actual local operating costs of all school administrative units of the base year 8 adjusted to the year prior to the year of allocation divided by the average total resident pupils 10 in sections 5104 and 6004 educated at public expense in 12 grades 9 to 12 on April 1st and October 1st of the calendar year prior to the year of allocation. 14 (3) A student enrolled in an equivalent instruction program at home who is within the school administrative 16 unit as defined in section 1, subsection 26 must be 18 counted as .25 of a full-time regular student for funding purposes. 20 22 **SUMMARY** 24 This bill requires that all homeschooled students participate in the Maine Educational Assessment and that these students be included in the school funding formula. 26
