COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 320, L.D. 410, Bill, "An Act to Provide Free Licenses to Harvest Marine Organisms for Persons Over 70 Years of Age"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Provide Noncommercial Combination Lobster and Scallop Licenses to Persons Over 70 Years of Age'

Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6311 is enacted to read:

§6311. Noncommercial combination lobster and scallop license to individuals 70 years of age or older

1. License. Notwithstanding any other provision under this Part, the commissioner may issue a noncommercial combination lobster and scallop license to an individual 70 years of age or older.

2. Licensed activities. An individual issued a noncommercial combination lobster and scallop license may engage in the licensed activities authorized pursuant to a noncommercial lobster and crab fishing license and a noncommercial scallop license.

6 This amendment replaces the original bill. It amends the
8 title and it creates a noncommercial combination lobster and
10 scallop license for people 70 years of age or older. It allows a
12 license holder to engage in the licensed activities authorized
pursuant to a noncommercial lobster and crab fishing license and
a noncommercial scallop license. It also places limitations on a
license holder. The amendment also provides that a noncommercial
combination lobster and scallop license expires on December 31st
and it sets a fee of \$10. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
