Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as fo	oliows
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- 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7013, sub-§7-A, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 4 408, §1, is amended to read:
- 6 Animal damage control. The coordination of animal throughout control functions the State, 8 supplemental assistance for the control of eeyetes--and--ether nuisance wildlife which that exceeds normal funding and staffing 10 level within the department;
- Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7035, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1999, c. 636, 12 §1, is further amended to read:

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Destruction of wildlife. Whenever the commissioner determines accomplishment necessary for the commissioner's statutory duties, the commissioner may issue 18 permits authorizing persons to assist the commissioner in the taking and destruction of any wildlife. Pursuant--to--section 20 7013,--subsection-7-A,--the-eemmissiener-shall-maintain-a-eeyete eentrel-program-as-fellows.
