Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further

4. Appointments: meetings. **Resolved:** 10 Sec. That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 12 notified Legislative Council must be by the appointing 14 authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the chairs of the commission shall convene the first meeting of the commission no 16 later than August 21, 2002. The chairs of the commission shall call no more than 4 meetings; and be it further 18

20 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study issues associated with being a father in the State.

1. In conducting the study, the commission shall:

A. Determine the multiple barriers to fathers' involvement 26 in the lives of their children;

28 B. Identify the availability of private and public services statewide to enhance the parenting abilities of fathers;

C. Identify significant personal, institutional, legal and cultural barriers to active, positive parenting by fathers; and

D. Identify and develop strategies to improve the parenting abilities of fathers across the socioeconomic spectrum and varying resident status; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

44 Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to the legislative per diem, as 46 defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their 48 attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Public members not otherwise compensated by their employers or other

Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 4 its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, no later than November 6, 2002. The commission is authorized to 6 introduce legislation related to its report to the First Regular Session of the 121st Legislature. If the commission requires a 8 limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to 10 the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the 14 commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 16 Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission's exceeding its 18 approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the 20 commission chairs and staff with a status report on the 22 commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further 24

Sec. 10. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made. 26

The Legislature will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$3,700 in fiscal year 2002-03 for the per diem
and expenses of legislative members and the reimbursement of necessary expenses for public members of the Commission on
Fatherhood Issues, and to print the required report.

10 The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the commission during the interim between 12 legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting 14 deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may 16 require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.'

**SUMMARY** 

22 This amendment replaces the original concept draft with a resolve to create the Commission on Fatherhood Issues consisting 24 of 9 members appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The commission will 26 study issues concerning the barriers to being an involved father in Maine. In addition to looking at specific issues, the 28 commission will also identify and develop strategies to improve the parenting abilities of fathers.
