COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 144, L.D. 488, Bill, "An Act to Correct an Error in the Bureau of Parks and Lands Statute"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 2 in the last line (page 1, line 10 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "bureau." the following: 'When the bureau directs the discontinuance of a road and the landowner does not request the relocation of the road at the time of the bureau's directive, the bureau is not obligated to relocate that road.'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. This amendment clarifies that the Bureau of Parks and Lands is not required to relocate a road when the bureau is directing that the road be discontinued and the landowner does not request relocation at the time.
