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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to S.P. 145, L.D. 489

An employer sha ll may not discriminate between employees in
the same establishment on the basis of sex, by paying wages to
any employee in any occupation in this State at a rate less than
the rate at which he the employer pays any employee of the
opposite sex for comparable work on jobs which that have
comparable requirements relating to skill, effort and
responsibility. Differentials which that are paid pursuant to
established seniority systems or merit increase systems, or
difference in the shift or time of the day worked, -which that do
not discriminate on the basis of sex, are not within this
prohibition. No An employer may not discharge or discriminate,
against any employee by reason of any action taken by such
employee to invoke or assist in any manner the enforcement of
this section.

The Department of Labor shall annually report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor matters on progress made in the State to comply with this section. The report must be issued annually on Equal Pay Day as designated pursuant to Title 1, section 140.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The additional costs associated with submission of a certain annual report to the Legislature and with the annual proclamation by the Governor inviting people to observe Equal Pay Day can be absorbed by the Department of Labor and the Executive Department utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment designates the first Tuesday in April as Equal Pay Day and requires the Department of Labor to annually report the progress made in achieving equal pay to the Legislature's committee on labor. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
