## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- 2 Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1309, as amended by PL 1989, c. 585, Pt. E, 4 §19, is further amended to read: §1309. Interstate cooperation б 8 The Legislature encourages cooperative activities by the department and the agency office with other states for the 10 improved management of hazardous and solid waste; for improved, and as far as is practicable, uniform state laws relating to the management of hazardous and solid waste; and compacts between 12 this and other states for the improved management of hazardous 14 and solid waste. Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §2132, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1995, c. 465, 16 Pt. A,  $\S41$  and affected by Pt. C,  $\S2$ , is further amended to read: 18 State recycling goal. It is the pelicy goal of the 1. State to recycle or compost, by January 1, 1998 2003, 50% of the 20 municipal solid waste tonnage generated each year within the 22 State. 24 Sec. 3. 38 MRSA §2132, sub-§1-A is enacted to read: 26 1-A. State waste reduction goal. It is the goal of the State to reduce the annual generation of municipal solid waste tonnage by 5% by January 1, 2003 and by an additional 5% every 28 subsequent 2 years. This reduction in solid waste tonnage, after January 1, 2003, is a biennial goal. The baseline for 30 calculating this reduction is the 1999 solid waste generation 32 data gathered by the office. 34 SUMMARY 36 Consistent with the directive of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 2132, subsection 2, this bill establishes a 38 waste reduction goal to be met by January 1, 2003 and delays the 40 date by which the State is to meet the 50% recycling goal.
