Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1410, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

4 7. Maine Indian tribe identification cards. An official
6 identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe
8 in the State is deemed an identification card issued under this
10 section. Cards issued under this subsection may be issued only
12 to members of the tribe and must be stamped and issued by the
14 clerk of the tribe.

SUMMARY

16 This bill requires an official identification card issued by
a federally recognized Indian tribe in the State to be considered
an official state nondriver identification card.
