

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 398, L.D. 519, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Licensing Provisions for Private Investigators"

Amend the amendment in the first indented paragraph in paragraph A in the 3rd to 6th lines (page 1, lines 28 to 31 in amendment) by striking out the following: "as long as the 1,700 hours of employment occurred within a period of no less than one year and no more than 2 years from the date of being granted a license" and inserting in its place the following: 'The 1,700 hours must have been completed within 2 years after the date of issuance of the investigative assistant license but may not have been completed in less than one year after the date of issuance of the license'

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that the 1,700 hours of employment as an investigative assistant must be accomplished within 2 years after the date of issuance of the investigative assistant license but no earlier than one year after the date of issuance.
