If an oral examination is б 6. administered, the exam must be conducted by at least 2 trained examiners designated pursuant to section 7320, subsection 2, 8 paragraph D who are approved by the commissioner or members of the Advisory Board for the Licensing of Guides. 10 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7320, as amended by PL 1995, c. 667, Pt. A, 12 §26, is further amended to read: 14 §7320. Advisory board 16 Members. The Advisory Board for the Licensing of 1. Guides, established by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 23, 18 shall-consist consists of the following 7 8 members: 20 One subordinate officer of the department designated by Α. the commissioner; 22 B. Two wardens of the department; and 24 26 C. Four representatives of the public, with no more than 3 holding a license under this subchapter, to be appointed by 28 the Governor for a term of 3 years to reflect a wide diversity of guiding experience. At least 2 members shall must be chosen for their expertise in outdoor recreation. 30 The public members shall must be compensated as provided in 32 Title 5, chapter 379-; and D. One marine patrol officer of the Department of Marine 34 Resources. 36 2. Duties. The board has the following duties: 38 To provide advice and consent regarding rules proposed Α. 40 by the commissioner; At the request of the commissioner, to conduct oral 42 Β. examinations of applicants for guide licenses; and 44 C. To advise the commissioner on granting and revoking 46 guide licenses -; and 48 D.
