40	There is established the Maine Teachers Student Loan Forgiveness Program to be administered by the commissioner. The
40	program provides a student loan forgiveness incentive to
42	education graduates who teach in schools in this State with an
	additional incentive for science and mathematics teachers. The
44	amount of loan forgiveness is calculated based on the number of
	years of service as a teacher in this State, up to \$3,000 per
46	year for loans incurred at a college or university in this State
	and up to \$5,000 per year for a teacher with a master's degree or

SUMMARY

This bill creates a state fund to provide a subsidy of up to \$2,000 per district to help schools hire teachers for hard-to-fill positions. The bill sets a minimum teacher salary of 1.5 times the federal poverty level for a family of 3 with an additional \$2,000 differential for teachers with master's degrees. The bill also establishes the Maine Teachers Student Loan Forgiveness Program as an additional incentive for teachers to teach in schools in this State.
