RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Value All Land Based on Its Current Use.

Resolved:** Two thirds of each 2 branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

Constitution, Art. IX, §8, first ¶ is amended to read:

Section 8. Taxation. All taxes upon real and personal 8 estate, assessed by authority of this State, shall must be apportioned and assessed equally according to the just <u>current</u> 10 use value thereof.

14 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to require that taxes upon real and personal property be assessed according to the current use value of the property?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall 28 vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, 30 counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as 32 votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review 34 the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the 36 Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

40 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the 40 Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution 42 necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.
