	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2075, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1993, c.
4	683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:
6	<b>3. Municipal authority.</b> A <u>Except as provided in this</u> <u>subsection, a</u> municipality may not alter a speed limit or enact
8	or enforce a regulation contrary to this Title. A municipality may:

12	A. Regulate traffic by means of signal devices or other appropriate methods on a way on which traffic is heavy or continuous;
14	B. Limit traffic to one-way traffic on a way, subject to
16	Title 23, section 1351;
18	C. Regulate speed of vehicles in public parks by erecting at all entrances to the park adequate signs giving notice of
20	the special speed regulations; and
22	D. With the approval of the Department of Transportation and the Chief of the Maine State Police, increase the speed
24	limit on through ways by erecting adequate signs giving notice of the speed limit <del>, ; and</del>
26	E. Decrease the speed limit in an area that has a speed
28	limit of 25 miles per hour to 15 miles per hour. The municipality may decrease the speed limit only after a
30	public hearing and upon a vote of the municipal officers. A municipality that decreases a speed limit pursuant to this
32	paragraph shall inform the Department of Transportation in writing of the reduction within 10 days of the vote reducing
34	the speed limit.

40	Current law prohibits a municipality from changing a speed limit on a road within the municipality except with the approval of the Department of Transportation and the Chief of the State
42	Police.
<b>4</b> 4	This bill allows a municipality, after a public hearing and vote of the municipal officers, to decrease the speed limit in a
46	25-miles-per-hour zone to 15 miles per hour.
