Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3961, as amended by PL 1999, c. 254, §8, is
repealed and the following enacted in its place:
§3961. Reimbursement for damage done by animals
1. Injuries and damages by animal. When an animal damages
a person or that person's property due to negligence of the animal's owner or keeper, the owner or keeper of that animal is
liable in a civil action to the person injured for the amount of
damage done if the damage was not occasioned through the fault of
the person injured.
2. Injuries by dog. Notwithstanding subsection 1, when a
dog damages a person the owner or keeper of the dog is liable in
a civil action to the person injured for the amount of damage
done if the damage was not occasioned through the fault of the
person injured.
SUMMARY
This bill makes the owner of a dog responsible for a
person's injuries caused by the owner's dog damaging that person.
