Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Department of Labor; vacant position. The Department of Labor, Division for the Blind and Visually Impaired must fill the vacant position assigned to the Iris Network's computer access program in the Augusta region. The Department of Labor must consult with the Iris Network to ensure that any potential candidate has professional training in blind rehabilitation and a strong background in access technology.

This bill directs the Division for the Blind and Visually Impaired within the Department of Labor to fill a vacant position assigned to the Iris Network's computer access program in Augusta. It also directs the department to consult with the Iris Network to ensure that the individual hired has professional training in blind rehabilitation.
