Instead of increasing the number of worker advocates and staff at the Workers' Compensation Board, the amendment proposes to reduce the 42 workload of existing advocates by improving board efforts to identify and penalize companies that are misusing and overloading 44 the system by unreasonably contesting claims. It authorizes the 46 board to use up to \$40,000 of its reserve account to improve technology for the audit, enforcement and monitoring program. It also requires the board to report to the Joint Standing Committee 48 on Labor its plan for improving implementation of the law that
