COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 540, L.D. 695, Bill, "An Act to Expand Opportunities for Education, Training and Employment for Displaced Homemakers"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

All Other \$118,292 \$195,431

Provides funds to increase statewide education, training and employment and self-employment services for displaced homemakers that lead to economic self-sufficiency and continue to build program capacity to coordinate and deliver these services and to measure outcomes. The appropriation will provide for increased

staff to provide service
delivery in Washington County
and Oxford County beginning
in fiscal year 2001-02 and
Waldo County and Piscataquis
County beginning in fiscal
year 2002-03.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the
summary the following:

This bill includes General Fund appropriations of \$118,292
and \$195,431 in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, respectively,
for the Maine Centers for Women, Work and Community to expand
certain services.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint
Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs,
eliminates funding in the bill for the creation of new service
delivery sites in rural Cumberland County and York County. The
amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to
the bill.
