An Act to Require that a Residential Facility for the Elderly Have an Automatic Door at the Main Entrance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2592, as amended by PL 1997, c. 728, §16, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

б The main entrance to a nursing home or other residential facility must have an automatic or power-assisted door, as 8 defined in the standards of construction. For purposes of this paragraph, "standards of construction" has the same meaning as in 10 Title 5, section 4594-D, subsection 1, paragraph C. This paragraph applies to any nursing home or other residential 12 facility constructed on or after January 1, 2002 or when the estimated total costs for remodeling, enlarging or renovating an 14 existing nursing home or other residential facility exceed \$100,000 and the remodeling, enlarging or renovation is begun on 16 or after January 1, 2002.

SUMMARY

This bill applies to new construction and major remodeling, enlarging and renovating on or after January 1, 2002 of nursing homes or other residential facilities. The entrance to these nursing homes and other residential facilities must have automatic doors or power-assisted doors.

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
