Sec. 1. Pilot program; Maine's French heritage. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall conduct a pilot program in 2 kindergartens located in Augusta, the Lewiston-Auburn area, the St. John Valley, Biddeford and other communities with a significant Franco-American population to promote ethnic 6 diversity and Maine's French heritage. At a minimum, the pilot program must include teaching the French language. department shall adopt routine technical rules pursuant to the 8 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A to 10 implement the program.
