32	'Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission

38	Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 6 members:
10	1. Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed
12	by the Speaker of the House. When making these appointments, the Speaker shall give preference to members of the House who are
14	knowledgeable on matters pertaining to vocational education. The first appointed member from the House is the House chair of the commission; and

	2. Three members of the Senate, appointed by the President

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of the Senate. When making these appointments, the President

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shall give preference to members of the Senate who are knowledgeable on matters pertaining to vocational education. The first appointed member from the Senate is the Senate chair of the commission; and be it further

- Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the appointments have been made. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall notify the chairs when all appointments have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission any time after the effective date of this resolve; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Stakeholder group established by the commission. Resolved: That the commission shall form a stakeholder group to assist and advise the commission on matters pertaining to the operation of the existing vocational education program in the State and on matters pertaining to the establishment of a 4-year vocational education program. The stakeholder group consists of, but is not limited to, at least one representative of each of the following groups: vocational school teachers, administrators and directors; the Department of Education; elementary and high school teachers, principals and superintendents; the State Board of Education; persons representing each of the trade associations in the State. The stakeholder group may also include any other persons chosen by the commission; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the feasibility of establishing a 4-year vocational education program in the State. In conducting the study the commission shall review any applicable studies on this subject previously conducted in the State, review and assess 4-year vocational education programs in other states, determine the need for such a program in the State in each of the trade groups, review issues related to the start-up of such a program including issues of access, choices of curricula, scheduling, consistency with goals of the statewide system of learning results, questions of capacity and coordination and any other issues considered relevant by the commission or the stakeholder group; and be it further
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission. The Office of Fiscal and Program Review and the Department of education also shall provide assistance as requested by the commission; and be it further

Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further
