  - Sec. BBBB-15. Establishment of the Long-term Care Implementation There is established the Long-term Implementation Committee, referred to in this section as the "committee," to monitor the progress of state departments and offices in implementing the provisions of this Part and the State's long-term care system. The committee shall review the adoption and amendment of rules perfermed proposed in response to this Part and may make recommendations to the Department of Human Services, to the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters for regarding amendments to those rules. committee shall review the quality of care in the long-term care system.
- The committee consists of 13 15 members. Membership. 28 The President of the Senate shall appoint 5 6 members as follows: one member representing providers; one member representing the 30 Long-term Care Steering Committee; ene--member 2 members representing consumers of long-term care services; and Legislators, one representing the joint standing committee of the 32 Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters and one representing the joint standing committee of the 34 Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial 36 affairs. One Legislator must represent the majority party and one Legislator must represent the minority party. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 5 6 members as 38 person follows: one representing providers; one 40 representing the long-term care ombudsman program; ene-member 2 members representing consumers of long-term care services; and 2 42 Legislators, one representing the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters and one representing the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial 46 affairs. One Legislator must represent the majority party and Legislator must represent the minority party. 48 Commissioner of Human Services or the commissioner's designee and 2 other persons representing the Department of Human Services,

The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to adopt rules and to coordinate its efforts relating to the delivery of long-term care services with the quality improvement committee. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

This amendment replaces the bill. It provides for an agency that contracts to provide home care coordination for the Department of Human Services to establish a quality assurance review committee to review the provision of home care services. It specifies duties for the committee and to which entities the annual report must be provided. It adds 2 consumer or consumer advocate members to the Long-term Care Implementation Committee.

26 It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
