22	'5. Medication. The commissioner shall provide for the administration of medication within schools as follows.

26	A. The commissioner shall adopt or amend rules for the administration of medication in public or approved private
20	schools, including the <u>requirement that only a licensed</u>
28	physician, physician's assistant, nurse, nurse practitioner or medical technician or an unlicensed person trained and
30	certified by the department to administer medication may administer medication. The commissioner also shall adopt
32	rules for the training and certification of an unlicensed personnel person to administer-medication comply with this
34	paragraph. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375,
36	subchapter II-A.
38	B. Any public or approved private school shall have a
40	written local policy and procedure for administering medication. The written local policy must include the
