32	services for Maine children. Resolved: That the State Level Provider and Site Director Workgroup, established by the Commissioner of

The workgroup and the council shall report jointly to the Commissioner of Education describing their deliberations 6 and recommendations as a result of their collaboration. Α 8 preliminary report is due on October 10, 2001 and a final report The commissioner shall inform the on January 10, 2002. 10 Children's Cabinet of the content of the reports; and be it further

Sec. 2. Survey of families and contract providers. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Education shall collaborate with the Joint 14 Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, other 16 appropriate state and legislative agencies, the National Conference of State Legislatures and other qualified 18 organizations to develop a valid, unbiased instrument and methodology to survey families receiving early intervention and 20 special education services for children under 6 years of age and providers under contract with the Child Development Services 22 System to provide such services. The survey of families must include but is not limited to an evaluation of the opinion of families of children currently under the Child Development 24 Services System, including those with active service plans and 26 those in the "Childfind" process as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 7725 who do not yet have plans, regarding the quality of services received, regional site 28 outreach and in-take procedures, evaluation and eligibility 30 determinations, communications between families and regional the explanation of services system sites, available and procedures and the opportunity for families to participate in the 32 decision-making process. The survey of contract providers must include but is not limited to an evaluation of the opinion of 34 current contract providers under the Child Development Services System regarding state and site policies, interactions with site 36 staff, client referral, the promptness and rates of payment, effectiveness of "Childfind," the evaluation process and the 38 impact of in-house staff. Within available resources, the commissioner shall enter into an agreement with a competent 40 in-state firm or organization to administer the survey and to commissioner 42 and tabulate the results. The shall code collaborate with appropriate state and legislative agencies, the National Conference of State Legislatures and other qualified 44 organizations to interpret the results and to develop recommended modifications to the Child Development Services System to address 46 any problems identified in the survey. The commissioner shall report as provided in section 3 and also present the results to 48 the Maine Advisory Council on the Education of Children with Disabilities for review; and be it further 50

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Sec. 3. Commissioner's report. Resolved: That the Commissioner 2 of Education shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on 4 Education and Cultural Affairs not later than January 31, 2002. The report must include the results of the collaboration of the provider-director workgroup and Maine Advisory Council on the 6 Education of Children with Disabilities established in section 1 8 of the survey provided for in section 2 and the and commissioner's recommendations, if any, for the improvement of 10 early intervention and special education services for children from birth to under 6 years of age. The committee may introduce legislation for consideration during the Second Regular Session 12 of the 120th Legislature.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The bill requires the Commissioner of Education to collaborate with the Joint Standing Committee on Education and 22 Cultural Affairs to develop a survey. In developing the survey, 24 if the committee meets with the commissioner as part of an authorized interim committee meeting, the costs associated with 26 the meeting can be absorbed by the Legislature within existing budgeted resources. If the committee is required to meet solely for the purpose of collaborating with the commissioner, the 28 Legislature will require an additional General Fund appropriation 30 for Legislators' per diem and expenses. While the exact amount of funding can not be determined, the estimated cost for one 32 meeting of the full committee is \$1,365. The Department of Education can absorb any additional expense of the Commissioner associated with these activities. 34

36 The Department of Education will incur additional General Fund expense of an indeterminate amount to contract for the 38 administration and results tabulation of a survey of certain families and contract providers. The bill indicates the 40 Department of Education must conduct that activity within available resources.'

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SUMMARY

46 This amendment is the minority report on the bill jointly referred to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The amendment replaces the bill and makes it a resolve. It directs the Commissioner of Education's

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provider-director workgroup and the Maine Advisory Council on the
Education of Children with Disabilities to collaborate in the review of delivery of services to children with disabilities from
birth to under 6 years of age and to report to the Commissioner of Education with a preliminary report by October 10, 2001 and
with a final report by January 10, 2002. The report must address improved quality and consistency of services, professional
development needs and ways to improve interagency coordination and collaboration.

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The amendment also directs the Commissioner of Education in collaboration with the National Conference of State Legislatures, appropriate state agencies and legislative agencies and other qualified entities to conduct a survey of the families receiving services under the Child Development Services System and of the contract providers under that system. The survey must address all aspects of the system and may result in identification of information necessary to develop recommendations concerning whether and how the system needs to be revised.

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Finally the amendment directs the commissioner to report to 22 the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services 24 next January on the results of the collaboration of the provider-director workgroup and the Maine Advisory Council on the 26 Education of Children with Disabilities and the survey. The committee is authorized to introduce legislation next session.

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It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
