Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7827, sub-§28 is enacted to read:

28. Unlawful snowmobile sales without dealer's license. A person is guilty of unlawful snowmobile sales without a dealer's license if that person sells more than 8 snowmobiles that are less than one year old in one year and that person does not have a valid registration and license under section 7825.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7857, sub-§26 is enacted to read:

26. Unlawful ATV sales without dealer's license. A person is guilty of unlawful ATV sales without a dealer's license if that person sells more than 8 ATV's that are less than one year old in one year and that person does not have a valid registration and license under section 7855.

SUMMARY

This bill provides that selling annually more than 8 snowmobiles or ATV's that are less than one year old without a dealer's license is, by operation of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7901, a Class E crime.
