HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 623, L.D. 823, Bill, "An Act to Discourage Environmental Terrorism"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1-A in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page 1, lines 6 and 7 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "life or" the following: 'a crime that is'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1-A by striking out all of paragraphs A and B and inserting in their place the following:

'A. An injury in fact to persons; or

B. In the case of a crime that is destructive to property or business practices, a threat to public health or safety.'

SUMMARY

This amendment requires that the damage to property or business practices as a result of the protest must create a threat to public health or safety in order for it to be considered environmental terrorizing.
