6	SUMMARY
8	This amendment provides that the provisions of the bill do not apply to a person who is protesting the practices of a
10	business during a labor dispute, strike or lockout at that business.
12	This amendment requires that the damage to property or
14	business practices as a result of a crime that is destructive to property or business practices must create a threat to public
16	health or safety in order for it to be considered ecoterrorism.
18	This amendment includes knowingly exposing an animal to a contagious or infectious disease as a crime of ecoterrorism.
