The prohibition on the introduction of fish or fish eggs in certain locations may result in insignificant reductions of General Fund revenue from a decrease in the sale of fishing licenses by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required annual report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

14 SUMMARY

This amendment is part of the minority report and prohibits the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife from stocking with fish or fish eggs waters that the public does not have free access to or access to for a reasonable fee. The amendment also requires that the department report annually to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife matters regarding access to state-stocked waters and any fees being charged for access to those waters. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
