2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRS §10909** is enacted to read:

6 **§10909. Elderly students**

8 The university shall allow a person 65 years of age or older
10 to take one course per year in any university institution free of
12 charge if there is available space in the class.

one course per year free of charge in any University of Maine
System institution if there is available space in the class.
