Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Pornography, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

  - Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further
    - Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further
    - Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than December 15, 2001. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further
    - Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds; and be it further

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## **SUMMARY**

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This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve and is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. The Commission to Study Pornography shall examine state and federal laws regarding pornography and review relevant constitutional issues; convene at least 3 public hearings across the State to gather input from communities regarding the issues related to exposure of minors to pornography; evaluate local community models used to prohibit the dissemination pornography to minors and otherwise combat minors' exposure to pornography; and develop guidelines, including proposed enabling legislation if necessary, for communities to follow to reduce minors' exposure to pornography. The commission shall report its findings and any proposed legislation to the Legislature no later than December 15, 2001. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
