34	 Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first named House member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further
- 12 Sec. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 14 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the appointments and selections have been made. When the appointment 16 of all members has been completed, the chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no 18 later than 30 days after the appointment of all members is 20 complete; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

- 24 1. Conduct a comprehensive review of Maine's laws and other states' laws pertaining to penalties imposed for crimes against children;
- 28 2. Review sentencing practices and patterns for crimes against children in this State, paying particular attention to sex offenses and murder and manslaughter cases; and
 - 3. Evaluate the effectiveness and proportionality of those penalties and sentences and the need, if any, for the State to modify its current sentencing guidelines for crimes committed against children; and be it further
 - Sec. 6. Staff. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing assistance to the commission; and be it further
 - Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

10	The Legislature will require an additional General Fund appropriation of \$3,300 in fiscal year 2001-02 for the per diem
12	and expenses of legislative members and other eligible members of the Commission to Study the Laws Governing the Sentencing of a
14	Person Convicted of a Crime Involving a Child and to print the required report.
16	
18	The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the commission during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing
20	existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting deadline is granted and the commission requires staffing
22	assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for
24	staff services.
26	The Judicial Department and the Department of the Attorney General will incur some minor additional costs to serve on the
28	commission. These costs can be absorbed within the departments' existing budgeted resources.'

32	SUMMARY
34	This amendment replaces the resolve. The amendment establishes the Commission to Study the Laws Governing the
36	Sentencing of a Person Convicted of a Crime Involving a Child, the duties of which include: conducting a comprehensive review of
38	Maine's laws and other states' laws pertaining to penalties

imposed for crimes against children; reviewing 40 practices and patterns for crimes against children in this State, paying particular attention to sex offenses and murder and 42 manslaughter cases; and evaluating the effectiveness proportionality of those penalties and sentences and the need, if any, for the State to modify its current sentencing guidelines 44 for crimes committed against children. The commission shall 46 deliver its report and any proposed legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. It also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve. 48

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
