	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whomas the state of the state o
6	Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative
8	session; and
10	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
12	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
16	Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Blue Ribbon Commission on the East-West Rail Corridor, referred to in this
18	resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further
20	Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 12 members:

26	2. Two members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House, one of whom represents the party

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	Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member
8	is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the commission;

12	Sec. 4. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all
14	appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the

40	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
42	shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the
46	commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative

per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred for

their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other

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members of the commission who are not otherwise compensated by their employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement of necessary expenses incurred for their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

- Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature no later than November 1st. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its work, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further
- Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 14 with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the 16 commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the 18 Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the commission exceeding its 20 approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly provide the 22 commission chairs and staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds. 24
  - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

32 This resolve establishes a Blue Ribbon Commission on the East-West Rail Corridor to examine the benefits, feasibility and viability of an east-west rail corridor in the State.
