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2 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 4 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 6 safety; now, therefore,

8 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §434, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1999, c. 504, §1, is amended to read:

1. Agricultural enterprise. "Agricultural enterprise" means a person or business located in this State and engaged in 14 the commercial growing or harvesting of plants; raising of animals; growing or obtaining plant or animal by-products; 16 aquaculture, as defined in Title 12, section 6001, subsection 1; 18 or further processing, storing, packaging or marketing a raw product derived from plants, animals, plant or animal by-products 20 or aquaculture, as defined in Title 12, section 6001, subsection 1, with the intent that the product be sold or otherwise disposed "Agricultural enterprise" includes a 22 of to generate income. business or activity that attracts visitors to a farm for the 24 purpose of supplementing income from the primary crop or livestock operation. "Agricultural enterprise" does not include a business engaged primarily in the growing, harvesting or 26 further processing of forest species of trees for the purpose of 28 producing pulp or other materials used in the paper manufacturing or wood manufacturing process.

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §435, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 658, 32 §1, is amended to read:

34 3. Interest rate. The commissioner, by rule, may establish an interest rate for a loan, except that this rate may not be 36 less than loans is 5% per year. If the commissioner does not establish an interest rate, the rate on a loan is a rate that is 38 2%-less than the prime rate of interest as is determined by the commissioner.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §435, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. Report. The commissioner shall submit an annual report on or before March 1st of each year to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters. The report must include a summary of loans made during the previous calendar year and loans outstanding categorized by the types of agricultural enterprises receiving the loans.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

 Establishing a fixed interest rate for the Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund may increase the use of the fund; the amounts
can not be determined at this time. Increased use of the Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund will not have any fiscal impact
on the operations of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.

The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report pertaining to the Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

26 The amendment replaces the bill. It provides for all loans under the Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund to have a 5% annual interest rate. This amendment also requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to submit an annual report 30 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters. It also adds an 32 emergency preamble and clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
