2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
4	CONCEPT DRAFT SUMMARY

8	This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.
10	This bill proposes to authorize the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health to designate Health Districts for planning and developing health promotion and disease prevention
12	services for all citizens of Maine. Once established, the Health Districts will encourage and support equitable distribution of
14	health promotion and disease prevention services and will improve access to health care and create local leadership for activities
16	to improve the health and well-being of Maine citizens.
18	This bill also proposes to provide funds to support the work of a coordinating Health District Council in each Health
20	District. The Health District Councils, which will include the agencies, hospitals, schools and municipal governments who can
22	assist with access to and delivery of health promotion and disease prevention services, would be responsible for ensuring
24	that the following 10 essential public health services are adequately addressed within the various elements of the health
26	system in each region:
28	1. Monitoring health status to identify community health problems;
30	2. Diagnosing and investigating health problems and health
32	hazards in the community;
34	 Informing, educating, and empowering people about health issues;
36	4. Mobilizing community partnerships and acting to identify
38	and solve health problems;
40	5. Developing policies and plans that support individual and community health efforts;
42	6. Enforcing laws and regulations that protect health and
44	ensure safety;

7. Linking people to needed personal health services and ensuring the provision of care when otherwise unavailable;

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8. Ensuring a competent public health and personal health care workforce;

9. Evaluating effectiveness, accessibility and quality of personal and population-based health services; and

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- 10. Researching for new insights and innovative solutions to health problems.
- Funding for the program is estimated at \$3,875,000 in the first year and continuing with annual cost-of-living increases in each future year. This bill proposes to fund these costs by increasing the cigarette tax.
