FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources will incur some minor additional costs to adopt certain rules pertaining to the implementation of a Salmonella enteritidis risk reduction and surveillance program. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.
