by 4 inch" block format would be \$8,758. If more information were to be provided in the ad, or if the public notice were for more than one initiative, the size of the ad, as well as the cost, would increase.'

## **SUMMARY**

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Legal and Veterans Affairs. This amendment strikes the provision in the bill that requires that citizen initiative petitions include an economic and environmental impact statement prepared by the Executive Department, State Planning Office. It retains the provision that requires the Secretary of State to hold a public hearing on the wording of the ballot question.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
