An Act to Eliminate the Fees Imposed on Purple Heart Recipients for Special Registration Plates.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §524, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1995, c. 645, Pt. B, §11, is further amended to read:

6 4. Purple Heart medal recipients; special license plates. The Secretary of State, on application and upon evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 36, section 1482, and the registration fee required by section 501 and--a--one-time
additional-fee-of-\$10, shall issue a registration certificate and a set of Purple Heart registration plates, to be used in lieu of
regular registration plates, to a person who is a Purple Heart medal recipient. The-one-time-additional-fee-of-\$10--is-credited
to-the-Highway-Fund-for-administrative-and-production-cests.

16 An application for Purple Heart plates must be accompanied by proof that the applicant has been awarded the Purple Heart
18 medal. The Secretary of State shall verify the documentation presented by the applicant. Misrepresentation of documents is in
20 violation of section 2103, subsection 5.

22 The Secretary of State may only issue Purple Heart plates for display on an automobile or pickup truck. A Purple Heart 24 recipient may be issued Purple Heart plates for no more than 2 vehicles.

The surviving spouse of a Purple Heart recipient issued plates in accordance with this subsection may retain and display the Purple Heart plates as long as the surviving spouse remains unmarried. Upon remarriage, the surviving spouse may not use the Purple Heart plates on a motor vehicle, but may retain them as a keepsake. Upon the death of the surviving spouse, the family may retain the Purple Heart plates, but may not use them on a motor vehicle.

36 The Secretary of State shall determine the design of the Purple Heart plate. Upon request and as provided by section 453, the 38 Secretary of State shall issue Purple Heart plates that are also vanity plates. Purple Heart vanity plates are issued in 40 accordance with this section and section 453. The annual service fee of \$15 for vanity plates is credited to the Highway Fund.

A Purple Heart recipient or the surviving spouse of a Purple
 Heart recipient, who does not operate a motor vehicle or register
 a motor vehicle and who otherwise qualifies for the issuance of
 special Purple Heart registration plates may apply to the
 Secretary of State for a special single plate recognizing that
 award.

50 The Secretary of State shall design and identify these single

plates for recognition purposes only. Single Purple Heart plates may not be attached to a motor vehicle. Only one plate may be 2 issued to each recipient and a one-time fee of \$5 charged. 4 The Secretary of State shall begin issuing Purple Heart plates in accordance with this subsection no later than November 1, 1995. б 8 **SUMMARY** 10 Under current law, a Purple Heart medal recipient may be 12 issued a set of Purple Heart registration plates upon application and payment of excise tax, registration fee and a one-time additional fee of \$10. This bill eliminates the \$10 fee. 14
