Presented by Representative GOODWIN of Pembroke. Cosponsored by Senator: SHOREY of Washington and Representatives: BUNKER of Kossuth Township, MORRISON of Baileyville. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the scallop season runs from December 1st to April 15th; and

8 Whereas, it is necessary that this legislation be enacted as an emergency so that it will take effect during the scallop 10 season; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

20 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6728 is enacted to read:

22 §6728. Daily catch limit

A holder of a scallop boat license is limited to a daily catch of 225 pounds of scallops per day or the equivalent, as
measured by 25 gallons of scallops or 18 standard totes of scallops.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the 30 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.
