22	Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:
24	'Sec. 3. Application. This Act applies to causes of action accruing on or after the effective date and to causes of action
26	for which the statute of limitations has not expired as of the effective date.'
28	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the
30	summary the following:
32	FISCAL NOTE
34	This bill may increase the number of civil suits filed in the court system. The additional workload and administrative
36	costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
38	Department. The collection of additional filing fees may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

42	SUMMARY
44	This amendment adds an application section to the bill to enable any person whose statute of limitations has not yet
46	expired to take advantage of the law change. Therefore, a minor whose statute of limitations has not run out by the effective
48	date of the Act would have 180 days after attaining 18 years of age to give notice of an action and 2 years after attaining 18
50	years of age to bring the action. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
