An Act to Reduce Tuition at Postsecondary Education Institutions of the State for Students Who Maintain a 3.0 Grade Point Average in High School.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §10909 is enacted to read:
§10909. Reduced tuition
1. Eligibility. A graduate from a secondary school in the State who graduates with a grade point average of at least 3.0 or the equivalent and gualifies for in-state tuition may receive a reduced tuition at a university institution if:
A. The student attends the university institution within a years of graduating from secondary school; and
B. The combined income of the parents of the student is \$30,000 or less.
2. Reduction levels. The reduction in in-state tuition for a student who gualifies under subsection 1 is:
A. Five percent for the student's first year;
B. Five percent for the student's 2nd year;
C. Ten percent for the student's 3rd year; and
D. Ten percent for the student's 4th year.
Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §12723 is enacted to read:
§12723. Reduced tuition
1. Eligibility. A graduate from a secondary school in the State who graduates with a grade point average of at least 3.0 of the equivalent and qualifies for in-state tuition may receive reduced tuition at a college if:
A. The student attends the college within 2 years of graduating from secondary school; and
B. The combined income of the parents of the student is \$30,000 or less.
2. Reduction levels. The reduction in in-state tuition fo a student who gualifies under subsection 1 is:
A. Ten percent for the student's first year; and
B. Ten percent for the student's 2nd year.

SUMMARY

4 This bill allows secondary school students who graduate with at least a 3.0 grade point average to receive reduced tuition at 6 the University of Maine System or the Maine Technical College System.
